- People under 65 with chronic health conditions
- Pregnant women
- Children 6 months to less than 5 years of age
- Health care workers
- Household contacts and care providers of persons at high risk who cannot be immunized or may not respond to vaccines

**If you are not in one of these priority groups, you will not receive a vaccination at this time.**
