Background Information:

The TDSB declared their Lothian site surplus to its needs at their meeting on June 24/25, 2009. The City owns the abutting property (the former Fairfield Public School) which is currently used by Parks and Recreation as the **Fairfield Seniors' Community Centre**. The neighbourhood park to the south of the Community Centre is also owned by the City. It is not affected by this decision of the TDSB. The parking lot however, behind the community centre is owned by the TDSB and therefore has been declared surplus and is for sale. Please see map on back of this notice which details lands owned by the TDSB and City of Toronto.

Purpose of this Neighbourhood Meeting:

I am hosting this meeting and have invited the TDSB Chair & Trustee Bruce Davis, City Staff from Parks and Recreation and the Real Estate Division of the City of Toronto to attend and answer your questions. The purpose of this meeting is to allow the residents in this area the opportunity to learn more about the implications of this decision of the TDSB. The parking lot is needed for Fairfield's patrons and I plan to continue working with Staff and the TDSB to secure a land purchase or land transfer which protects the needs of the Community Centre. The City and the TDSB are currently reviewing a number of options, which will be outlined at this meeting. Once a decision is made, I will again update the neighbourhood. In the meantime, your input is appreciated.
