Crime Prevention Tip of the Month:

Bullying

A bully is:

- A domineering person or group of persons who abuse others
- A person who tries to control others by fear
- A person who behaves in an aggressive, thoughtless and unjust manner

If you are a bully:

- Your reputation could suffer
- You could hurt someone
- You could become unpopular with friends
- You could disappoint your family
- You could be suspended from school
- Police will investigate
- If charged and convicted you will receive a criminal record

Reasons why people are bullies:

- Peer pressure
- They are looking for attention
- They have no friends
- They do not care about peoples feelings
- They are insecure
- They have been picked on in the past
- They want to feel accepted by others
- They want to be part of a gang/group
- Their behaviour is a reflection of personal problems

Bullying is a criminal offence:

- Assault
- Harassment
- Extortion
- Threatening
- Intimidation

If you are the victim of a bully:

- You may lose your self esteem
- You may feel humiliated
- Your physical health may suffer
- Your emotional health may be jeopardized
- You may skip school or refuse to go to school to avoid the bully
- Your grades may suffer
- You may feel like running away

Bullying impacts everyone in different ways. In some cases, victims could not bear the ridicule and taunting and have committed suicide.

Ways to avoid a bully:

- Stay together in a group
- Be brave
- Be confident
- Walk away from trouble
- Stick up for yourself
- Tell someone you trust

ROBBERY: Armed with Handguns

Officers from the division attended the Alderwood Childcare Center BBQ. Over two hundred people attended and the officers gave tours of the scout car and answered questions pertaining to bicycle and community safety.

Members of the CRU attended the Queensway Baptist Church for the 1st Annual Labour Day BBQ. Officers participated in numerous carnival games and attractions. Officers answered questions regarding bicycle safety and gave tours of the scout car.

On Monday, September 14th officers from the Toronto Police College and 22 Division, along with students from Second Street Public School, targeted speeders along Birmingham Street, east of Islington Avenue.

Traffic and pedestrian safety is a priority for the Toronto Police Service. As part of the "Back to School Campaign," police have partnered with schools, students and residents in the community. The purpose of the program is to bring greater awareness to drivers that excessive speed in a school zone has an effect on the school community. It will empower the participating students to take ownership of their community and change the driving habits of motorists.

The offending driver's speed was measured by a radar unit operated by officers and the speed was compared with the student's own mathematical measurements. The offending drivers were pulled over and given the option of receiving an offence notice from the officer or a lecture and student-made ticket from the students of Second Street Public School.

It is alleged that a suspect submitted false medical claims to her employer's health care insurer, receiving a large amount of money for services that never occurred. This occurred over an eight month period.

Arrested: MYRIE, Sann 25 years

Charged: Fraud Over \$5,000

NOTEWORTHY ARREST: Credit Card Fraud

On September 14th is alleged that:

- A suspect entered Queensway restaurant and purchased a large value of gift cards with a fraudulent credit card.
- The same suspect went to a second restaurant and repeated the act, but this time all the cards she provided were declined.
- The suspect was apprehended after a short foot chase.

At the time, the place was found to be a Gro-op, with almost 1800 plants in various stages of growth. A quantity of dried marihuana was also allegedly found. Two suspects were arrested. The street value of the seized drugs is estimated at \$1,800,000.
