### ***Berry Road Road Reconstruction*** **Prince Edward Drive to Park Lawn Road**

**Expected Start-up Date:      Week of April 14, 2008**  
**Expected Completion Date:    May 2008**

Construction work for the Reconstruction of Berry Road from Prince Edward Drive to Park Lawn Road is set to recommence Monday, April 14, 2008 after the winter disruption. Road work for the north half of Berry Road work will start from west of Park Lawn Road and proceed westerly. Berry Road from Caledon Road to Prince Edward Drive will be reinstated where the watermain was installed last year.

Every effort will be made to reduce the inconveniences that are inevitable with any construction project.

#### **Construction Details (unchanged from last year's notice)**

The existing watermain will be replaced and water services upgraded from the street to your front property line if required. As part of the roadwork new street catchbasins will be constructed. The roadway will be reconstructed including excavation of the old roadway, construction of new curb and gutter and subdrains, construction of new sidewalks where required, new roadway construction, asphalt paving and restoration of driveways and boulevards. Sidewalks will be rerouted in certain locations to better avoid existing trees and provide better pedestrian visibility. The new roadway width will be 8.5 metres and will accommodate one vehicle lane in each direction.

#### **Work Hours**

Work will run from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday with occasional work at night and on Saturdays. On occasion, the work day may extend to 7:00 p.m.

#### **Other Considerations**

Last year, OZA Inspections Limited on behalf of Gazzola Paving Ltd. visited your property to carry out a pre-construction condition survey. This survey was on a voluntary basis; however, it is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. In case damage occurs during construction due to construction activities, please contact Gazzola Paving Ltd. directly at 416-675-7007 as well as advise the undersigned.

During construction, traffic delays will occur and driveway access will be disrupted from time to time. Berry Road will be reduced to one lane controlled by flagmen during construction work. Access for emergency vehicles, school buses, TTC buses and important deliveries will be maintained. At times, access to your driveway(s) will be temporarily restricted to allow construction to take place.

During the construction period, TTC bus service will be maintained; however, bus stops will occasionally be relocated away from the work zone for certain periods of time for public safety reasons. The TTC will post the temporary stops not far from the original stops. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause you and trust that you will be patient during this process.

The Solid Waste Collection Division of the City requests that all waste and recyclable materials be at curb side no later than 7:00 a.m. on pickup day. Please use garbage bags during the construction period as waste and recyclable materials may be moved by the Contractor to central pickup points while construction is underway. Garbage cans may get lost during this process. Please mark your waste receptacle as well as blue boxes and green bins for easy homeowner identification.

We ask you to bring any concerns you may have regarding access and deliveries to your home to the City's attention right away so that co-ordination with the Contractor can take place. Supervision of the project will be carried out by the Technical Services Division of the City of Toronto. ### **TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF TRAFFIC IN WESTBOUND DIRECTION**

**FOR BERRY ROAD FROM PARKLAWN ROAD TO PRINCE EDWARD DRIVE  
Monday, April 14, 2008, 9:00am to Monday, May 19, 2008, 7:00am**

Construction work for the Reconstruction of Berry Road from Prince Edward Drive to Park Lawn Road is set to recommence Monday, April 14, 2008 with the resumption of road construction for the north side of Berry Road.

In order to properly carry out road reconstruction work for the north side of Berry Road in a safe, quick and efficient manner, the Technical Services and Transportation Services Divisions of the City of Toronto as the Road Authority plan to **temporarily close Berry Road to westbound traffic from Park Lawn Road to Prince Edward Drive** for a 5 week period starting Monday, April 14, 2008. The traffic restriction is necessary to safely construct the new roadway on the north side in an efficient manner and to provide protection for all pedestrians, vehicles and construction crews.

We apologize for this inconvenience and trust that you will be patient and understanding during this process.


During the 5 week period, access for emergency vehicles, local residents and garbage pick-up will be maintained on Berry Road. Local residents will be allowed access to their driveways as the work progresses. We caution Berry Road residents in the restricted area to remember to drive eastbound only when pulling out of their driveways. One Way black and white arrow signs will be posted at each sidestreet to direct residents to drive eastbound only when entering Berry Road. Please note that legal red and white “Do Not Enter” signs will be posted on Berry Road at Park Lawn Road to prevent westbound access onto Berry Road. Berry Road will be monitored by Toronto Police on a 24-hour basis to issue tickets for any observed infractions, including passing through a “Do Not Enter” sign.

The eastbound TTC bus route will remain unchanged during the closure; however, westbound buses will be detoured west on Keywell Court, south on Bonnyview Drive , north on Minstrel Drive, across Berry Road, north on Greenmount Road and west on Bethnal Avenue to Prince Edward Drive. The TTC will establish temporary transit stops along the temporary bus route. Parking will be temporarily prohibited on both sides of Greenmount Road and Bethnal Avenue to accommodate the buses. A separate TTC notice will be distributed with more details on route changes during the 5 week period.

### Parking Consideration

As you are aware, The City of Toronto is reconstructing Berry Road from Prince Edward Drive to Park Lawn Road. The contractor for this project is Gazzola Paving Limited.

Construction work for this project will be recommencing the week of April 14, 2008 after the winter disruption.

During road construction in 2008, there will be times when you will not have access to your driveway. The City has arranged for special consideration with the Toronto Police Service – Parking Enforcement West to allow parking beyond the 3 hour limit on the following streets ONLY:

- GLENN ARTHUR DRIVE between Berry Road and Keywell Court
- GLENN MURRAY DRIVE between Berry Road and Keywell Court
- BALLACAINE DRIVE between Berry Road and Edwalter Avenue
- BEAUCOURT ROAD between Berry Road and the south limit of the roadway
- GREENMOUNT ROAD between Berry and Bethnal Avenue

If you cannot access your driveway, please park on these streets within the noted limits according to the local parking restrictions. If you are ticketed for parking beyond the 3 hour limit on these streets within the noted limits, you must take your ticket to a Parking Authority First Offence Centre (listed on the back of the ticket) for rescinding. Please call the undersigned first to get an “FAF” number so that your ticket may be rescinded. Tickets for offences other than parking beyond the 3 hour limit or for parking in Parking Authority or private parking lots cannot be rescinded.

### Six Point Road

### Watermain and Water Service Replacement

**Expected Construction Start Date: Week of April 7, 2008**  
**Expected Construction Completion Date: Week of August 18, 2008**

The City of Toronto has awarded a contract to Co-X-Co Construction Limited for the replacement of the watermain and water services on Six Point Road from Islington Avenue to Kipling Avenue. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconveniences that are inevitable with any construction project.

### **Construction Details**

The watermain and water services will be replaced on Six Point Road from Islington Avenue to Kipling Avenue. Pavement, boulevards, sidewalks and other areas impacted by construction will be restored.

### **Work Hours**

Work will run from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday to Friday, with occasional work at night and on Saturdays until the work is completed.

### **Other Considerations**

During construction, traffic delays will occur and driveway access may be disrupted or restricted at times to allow construction to take place. Access for emergency vehicles and important deliveries will be maintained.

The Solid Waste Collection Division of the City requests that all waste and recyclable materials be at curb side no later than 7:00 am on pickup day. Please use garbage bags during the construction period as waste and recyclable materials may be moved by the Contractor to central pickup points while construction is underway. Garbage cans may get lost during this process. Please mark your waste receptacle and blue box for easy homeowner identification.

We ask you to bring any concerns you may have regarding access and deliveries to your home to the City's attention right away so that coordination with the Contractor can take place. Supervision of the project will be carried out by the Technical Services Division of the City of Toronto. ### **DUNDAS STREET OVER HUMBER RIVER STRUCTURE REHABILITATION**

The City of Toronto plans to rehabilitate the Dundas Street Bridge over the Humber River starting in July 2008 (**see map on reverse**). This work is being carried out as part of a bridge maintenance and improvement program. The purpose of the work is to:

- Restore and preserve the structural integrity of the bridge;
- Prolong the service life of the bridge;
- Achieve conformity with the current Canadian Highway Bridge Design Code; and
- Improve the durability of the structure.

Construction will begin in July 2008 and continue until December 2009.

### **Construction Details**

- ❖ The project will involve removal and reconstruction of concrete bridge deck and sidewalk, replacement of existing concrete parapet and hand railings; new waterproofing and asphalt, substructure repairs, and localized concrete repairs; relocation of utility plants off the bridges if possible.
- ❖ The work will be done in two stages.

**Stage 1** will involve work on the **north side** of the bridge with traffic on the south side (**July 2008 – February 2008**)

**Stage 2** will begin upon completion of stage 1. It will involve work on the **south side** of the bridge with traffic transferred to the north side (**February 2008 – December 2009**).

### **Pedestrian Access and Traffic Details**

One lane of vehicular traffic will be maintained in both directions for the duration of the rehabilitation work.

Pedestrians will be restricted to use the sidewalk on the south side when construction is on the north side of the bridge, and the sidewalk on the north side when construction is on the south side of the bridge.

Some noise is to be expected in the vicinity of the bridge during construction. All efforts will be made to minimize service interruptions during the removal of the concrete bridge decks and sidewalks. Minor service interruption is expected during the relocation of existing utilities. Notices will be sent out 48 hours in advance informing of any service interruptions.

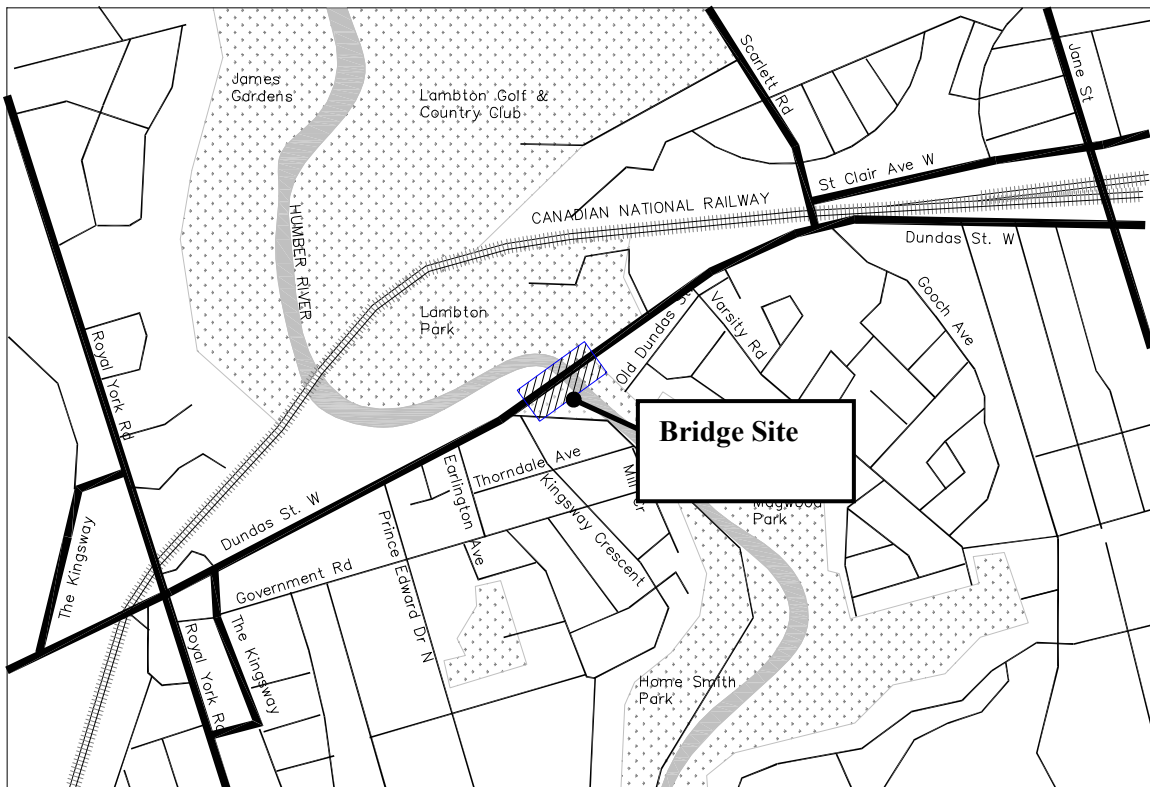
Advance traffic warning signs will be posted in the area to advise the public on traffic restrictions, lane closures and pedestrian crossings.

Access to the neighbouring homes and condominium will be maintained. Nearby schools and hospital will not be affected by this rehabilitation work.

### **Work Hours**

Construction work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. Extended hours and weekend work may be required in order to complete construction on schedule.
